About this Report

SM Entertainment promotes ESG management and publishes reports as a foundation for transparent communication with the company's various stakeholders and to disclose our performances.

Reporting Period

This report covers sustainable management activities and performance for the fiscal year 2023 (January 1, 2023 - December 31, 2023). For non-financial performance, some content from the first half of 2024 is included, and for some data that requires understanding of changes, data from the last three years (2020 - 2022) is reported. However, since there were some changes in governance in March 2024, the related content is reported as of March 31, 2024. The reporting cycle for this report is one year.

Reporting Scope And Criteria

The scope of this report includes SM Entertainment's domestic business sites and some of its affiliates (SM Life Design Group, SM Brand Marketing, Dream Maker Entertainment - three companies that carry out SM Entertainment's album, MD, and concert businesses).

This report was prepared in accordance with the GRI (Global Reporting Initiative) Standards 2021, an international reporting guideline for sustainable management, and it reflects indicators of the UN SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals), a sustainable management initiative. Financial performance was prepared in accordance with K-IFRS (Korean International Financial Reporting Standards).

Report Verification

To ensure the reliability of the report writing process and published information, the Korean Foundation for Quality (KFQ), an independent verification agency, conducted a third-party verification. The verification standard applied was AA1000AS (v3). The verification results can be found on page 93 of this report.

Dear Valued Stakeholders,

Greetings. This is CHEOL HYUK JANG and YOUNG JUN TAK, Co-Chief Executive Officers of SM Entertainment.

We are pleased to publish SM Entertainment's third Sustainability Report. This report is a vital document for transparently showcasing SM Entertainment's sustainable management achievements throughout 2023 and facilitating communication with stakeholders.

In 2023, SM Entertainment introduced SM 3.0, our new growth strategy, marking a significant leap forward. The launch of a Multi Production Center increased our album and digital music releases from 56 in 2022 to 64 in 2023, with physical album sales rising from 12.06 million copies in 2022 to 20.1 million copies in 2023.

Our new IP team, RIIZE, debuted and has been actively engaged in various activities. Following the debut of NCT WISH in February 2024, our new girl group and a virtual artist are scheduled to debut. Additionally, KMR, founded in July 2023 to initiate our publishing business in earnest, secured a pool of 84 songwriters and managed 1,507 songs under copyright by January 2024. With the establishment of KMR Europe in December 2023, we plan to further recruit local songwriters in North America by establishing an American subsidiary in 2024.

In addition to financial growth, we have also achieved outstanding results in non-financial areas.

First, we are committed to environmental management to respond to the climate crisis. In April 2023, We created the KWANGYA Forest to preserve biodiversity. We planted over 50 species of trees and 1,400 herbaceous plants to create a nature-friendly resting place, and its value was recognized by winning the grand prize at the Seoul Metropolitan City's Green City Award. We are also dedicated to increasing the use of eco-friendly materials in our album and MD production and using upcycled materials for our New Year's kits and some other MD.

We have taken steps towards implementing human rights management and foster a good workplace by operating various

in-house welfare systems and establishing human rights management principles. We have also launched the 'KWANGYA 119' website to protect our artists' rights, actively listen to fans' feedback, and collect information.

We have also innovated our governance to enhance sustainable stakeholder value. We have increased the number of external and female directors and fostered a board with independence, expertise, and diversity. Four subcommittees were formed under the board of directors. Among them, the Governance Committee deliberates and supervises our sustainable management agendas, thereby strengthening the board of directors' roles and responsibilities for sustainable management.

This year, SM Entertainment will create a great place to work and strengthen human rights management so that excellent talents can create quality content and strengthen our competitiveness. We will also pay more attention to fair trade and intellectual property protection. Environmentally, we will make various efforts to develop products made with eco-friendly materials and reduce waste. We also aim to lead more transparent and advanced governance through ethical and compliance management aligned with global sustainable management.

We kindly ask for your interest and support for SM Entertainment's constant challenges and innovations to become a global pioneer in the sustainable cultural industry.

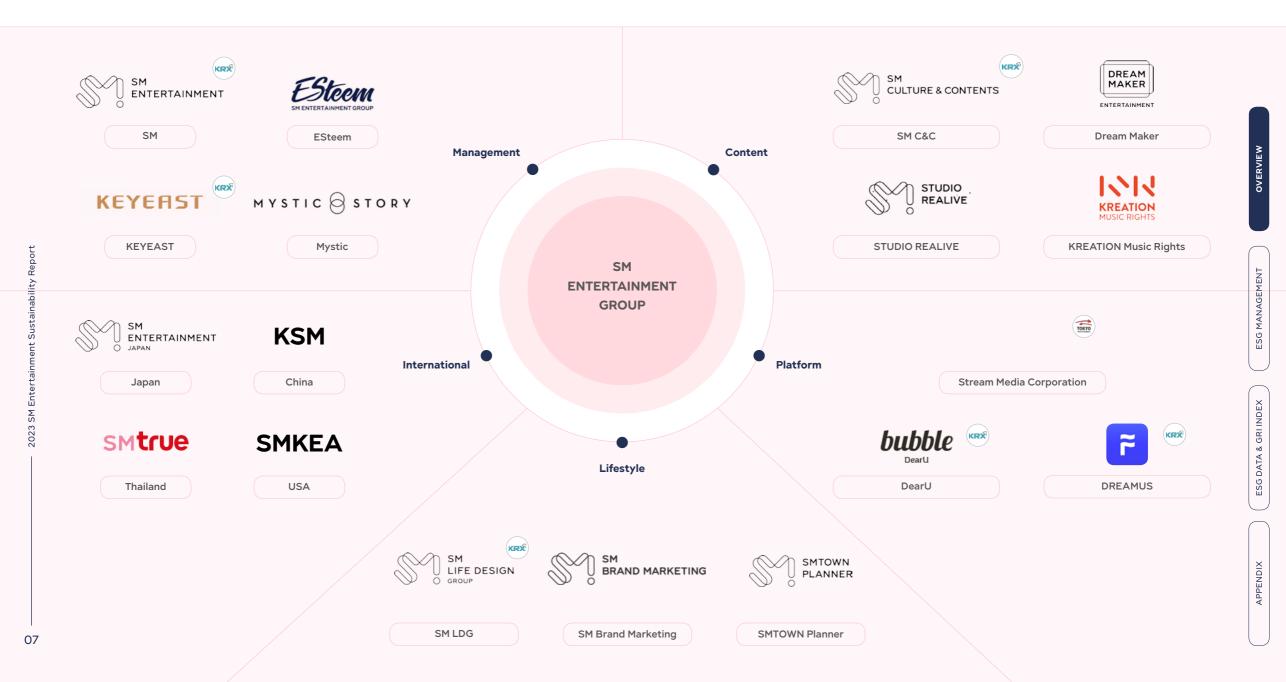

It devises and utilizes Culture Technology to create SM Culture Universe. Its main businesses are the music content business that plans, produces, and distributes albums, and the management businesses. Its subsidiaries are engaged in advertising, artist management, video content, and travel businesses.



Music

Over 3,000 world-class producers, songwriters, and composers collaborate with affiliated artists to create the best music content.

In 2023, total album sales exceeded 20 million copies, and Taeyeon, EXO, aespa, and RIIZE's songs have consistently ranked high on music charts, demonstrating meaningful results.











Concerts / Events

We hold numerous concerts and fan meetings every year. In 2023, we resumed full-scale concerts and offline events after COVID-19 and held approximately 340 concerts annually in Korea and abroad.

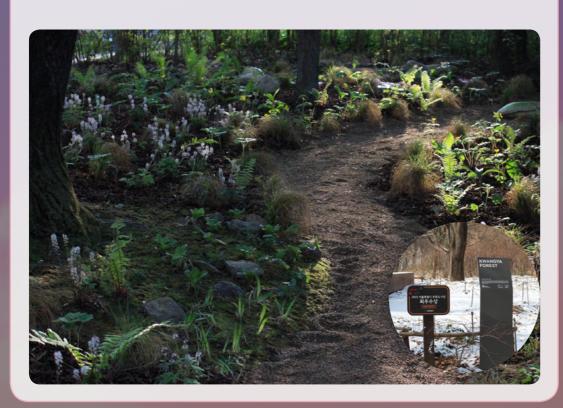

Creation Of KWANGYA Forest To Preserve Biodiversity

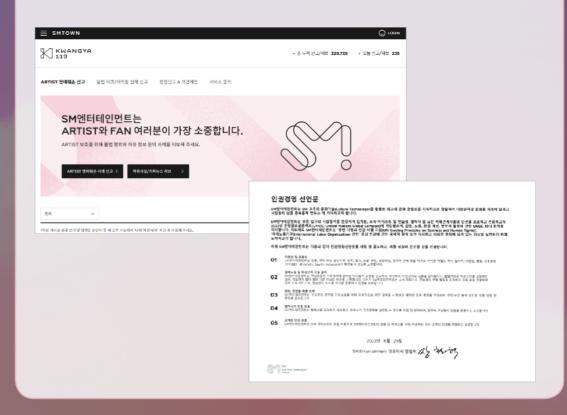
SM Entertainment created the KWANGYA Forest in Seoul Forest in April 2023 to preserve biodiversity. More than 50 species of trees and 1,400 herbaceous plants, including native plants such as primroses, hosta minor, and yellow violets, were planted to promote biodiversity in the city. Log chairs were installed to provide citizens with a nature-friendly resting space. In recognition of these efforts, the company won the grand prize of Seoul Metropolitan City's Green City Award in November 2023.

Establishment of KWYANGYA 119 And Human Rights Management Declaration

SM Entertainment has newly opened the KWANGYA 119 website to protect artists' human rights, listen to, and communicate with fans' opinions. As of December 2023, the service has received over 180,000 posts with a 95% response rate since its launch in June 2023. To establish a human rights management system, we have also published the Human Rights Management Declaration and posted it on our website.



2023 ESG Highlights



Increase Shareholder Value Through Cash Dividends And Treasury Stock Sales

SM Entertainment announced the SM 3.0 plan in February 2023 to increase sustainable shareholder value. By implementing SM 3.0, the company increased its corporate value, introduced advanced capital allocation and shareholder return policies, and established a transparent and sound governance structure to ensure proportional benefits for all shareholders and implementation of advanced shareholder return policies. Through this, the company paid its first dividend of KRW 200 per share in 2021, followed by dividends of KRW 1,200 per share in 2022 and 2023. The dividend yield reflecting the confirmed year-end dividend is 1.4%, which is 1% higher than the KOSDAQ 150 average of 0.4%. Additionally, the company is continuing its efforts to increase shareholder value by buying back 241,379 shares (approximately KRW 19 billion) of its own shares for the first time in February 2024.

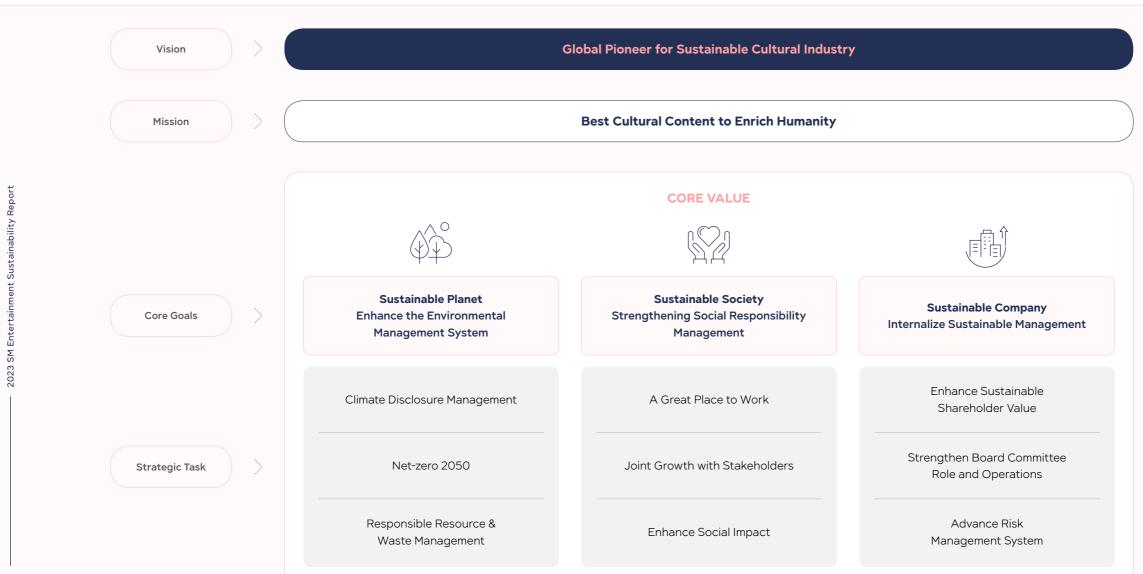

The ESG Working-level Consultative Body, consisting of heads of working departments and managers, holds regular meetings to promote sustainable management activities linked to each business. This help identify effective and specific implementation tasks for sustainable management and facilitate the sharing of their progress. The governance committee under the board of directors regularly reviews major agenda items related to sustainable management and approves mid- to long-term policies and goals for sustainable management, ethical practices, and strategies to enhance shareholder value and returns.

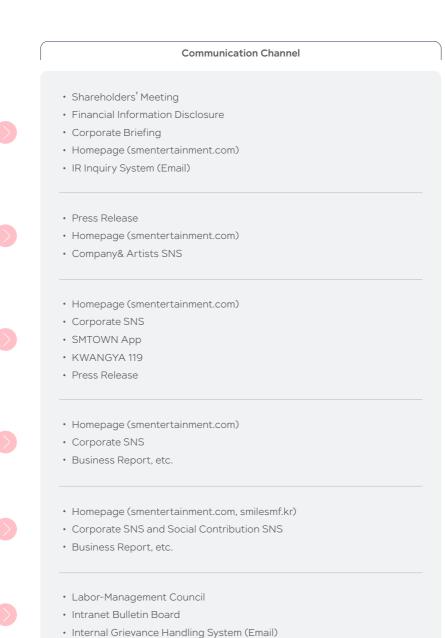

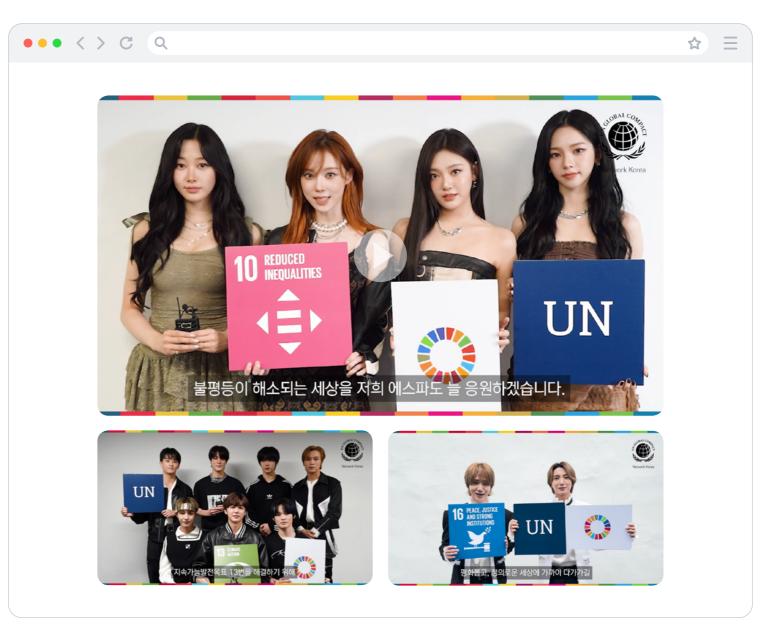

At the Korea Leaders Summit held by the UNGC Korea Association in November 2023, SM Entertainment artists introduced human rights, labor, environment, anti-corruption principles, and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and carried out a campaign to pledge to practice them. In addition, SM Entertainment trainees learn about human rights and labor through global citizenship education every year.

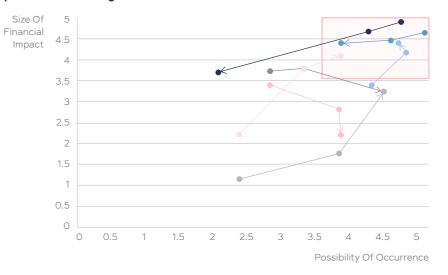
Three new issues were added to SM Entertainment's material issues: Improving the level of content and strengthening competitiveness fair trade and intellectual property protection, and ethics and compliance management. Waste generation management decreased in importance from 5th to 7th place but was still evaluated as an important management target. A good workplace rose from 3rd to 1st place, and human rights and labor rights protection rose from 4th to 2nd place compared to the previous year.

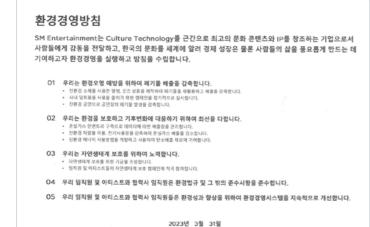
Environmental Management System

SM Entertainment is making multi-faceted efforts to produce eco-friendly MD and reduce waste generation. We are providing eco-friendly products to our employees and creating a work environment where they can contribute to protecting the environment in their daily lives. In addition, we are using FSC-certified paper for the production of albums and paper products and are expanding the use of soy ink and UV-coated paper that does not emit volatile organic compounds.

Artist Costume Inventory Reuse Initiative

SM Entertainment operates a dedicated department to systematically manages artist costumes. Costumes that once shone on stage are carefully stored and managed before disposal, and some of them are given new value through upcycling. SM Entertainment selects usable costumes through a system that tracks the condition and information. Through this system, we collaborated with fashion brands to upcycle artist costumes into new products. To commemorate the 15th anniversary of SHINee's debut, we exhibited art objects containing a sustainability message made from recycled stage costumes from 10 years ago at an art festival. In addition, we are planning a resource circulation project to sell usable costumes in collaboration with Charan, a startup company that extends the life cycle of clothing and contributes to environmental protection by collecting and selling used clothing.



Removal of Album Advertisement Inserts

As part of its commitment to a sustainable environment, SM Entertainment has decided to discontinue the issuance of advertising inserts included in albums. These inserts, consisting of five double-sided pages and delivering various news about SM Entertainment, will be discontinued starting April 2024. This initiative is expected to reduce paper usage and waste generation. News previously conveyed through these inserts will be provided via SM Entertainment's official website, SNS, etc.

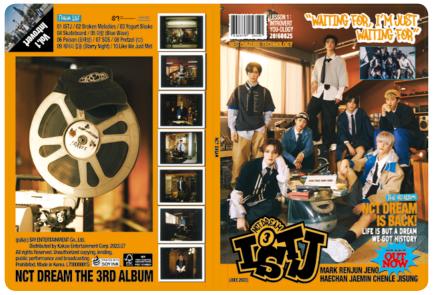

SM Entertainment uses Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) certified (FSC Mix) paper to produce albums and paper products to protect the world's forests. FSC certification guarantees that raw materials from certified forests are used in products through third-party verification to preserve the biological diversity of forests and benefit the lives of local residents. Since signing a promotion license agreement with FSC in May 2022, SM Entertainment has been expanding the use of FSC certified albums and goods using FSC certified paper. The number of albums using FSC certified paper has increased significantly from 4 in 2022 to 21 in 2023.

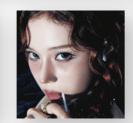








































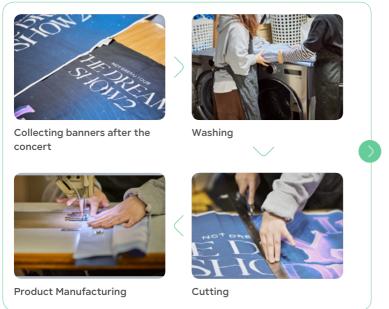
Eco-friendly MD and Service & Waste Management

Upcycling Waste Banners

SM Entertainment collected and stored banners used at its affiliated artists' concert halls in 2023 and produced upcycled products in 2024. The banners were turned into fabric pieces at a community self-sufficiency center, supporting the economic independence of low-income households. Paper tags were eco-friendly recycled paper made of 100% recycled pulp, and the packaging vinyl was made of 100% biodegradable resin. We transformed the banners into crossbody bags that can carry tumblers and accessories anytime, anywhere, and distributed to all employees on April 22, 2024, Earth Day. In addition, we made the 2023 NCT DREAM concert banners into keyrings and provided as gifts to the soundcheck audience at the 2024 NCT DREAM WORLD TOUR THE DREAM SHOW 3 Seoul concert. In this process, we upcycled approximately 105kg of banners and reduced and 30,450 (g/yr) of carbon dioxide emissions*.

Eco-friendly New Year KIT

SM Entertainment produces New Year's KITs for its employees at the beginning of each year. The 2024 New Year's KIT actively used more eco-friendly materials from the perspective of sustainable management and environmental management. We minimized post-processing and packaging to reduce environmental pollution that may occur during the production process. Notably, the walking bag, which is frequently used in daily life, is made with recycled nylon yarn derived from waste nylon raw materials extracted from fishing nets recycled and retrieved from the sea, and eco-friendly naphtha produced using pyrolysis oil from waste plastic. The kit also features notebook made with FSC-Certified paper and a hoodie designed to encourage energy efficiency during the winter months.



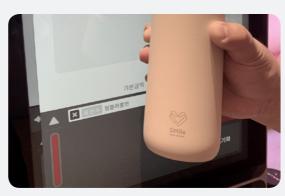

In order to create a safe workplace, we have established safety and health management policies and are practicing safety and health management through regular inspections, application, and improvement.

The related matters are reviewed and deliberated by the board of directors. We have established a safety and health organization by operating an Industrial Safety and Health Committee consisting of a safety manager, managers, and an equal number of management and labor representatives, and a Safety and Health Council that discusses safety issues with partners. We have conducted risk assessments to reflect the nature of our work, which involves a high proportion of vehicle driving, and established a management system based on this. We are also striving to create a safe workplace by following work checklists and safety management guides to prevent accidents at major sites such as pop-up stores and performance halls. We are also conducting industrial safety and health education for all executives and employees, and are meeting all required items, such as job training and chemical substance education.

Concert Hall Safety Management Details

SM Entertainment regulates related matters in accordance with the Industrial Safety and Health Act and the Act on the Punishment, etc. of Serious Disasters to ensure that work at the concert venue is carried out safely and manages the site accordingly. We ensure that all workers are aware of and comply with the precautions according to the checklist for overall performance venue work and the forklift work checklist, and that they can work according to safety rules. In particular, since it is a place where many people stay for a long time, we are checking the work order, precautions, emergency evacuation, etc. at each stage before, during, and after work.

Concert Hall Work Checklist

- Check the documents required for common work items
- Check the pre-work training and post-work confirmation items
- Emphasize high-risk items and guide to follow essential precautions during work
- Make sure all workers are aware of the right to stop work and guide them to sign after understanding work safety rules, etc.

Pop-up Store Safety Management Details

SM Entertainment operates a pop-up store as a complex cultural space utilizing artists and music IPs. A pop-up store serves as an experiential space where visitors can listen to music themed around artists' albums, and also as a place where lifestyle products leveraging artist and music IPs are available for purchase. Due to the high number of visitors, safety management is especially required. When constructing and demolishing offline stores such as pop-up stores, SM Entertainment clearly stipulates compliance matters throughout the entire process and implement safety management practices to reduce legal risks in accordance with the Industrial Safety and Health Act and the Punishment of Serious Accidents. This includes company selection, contracting, and on-site operations.

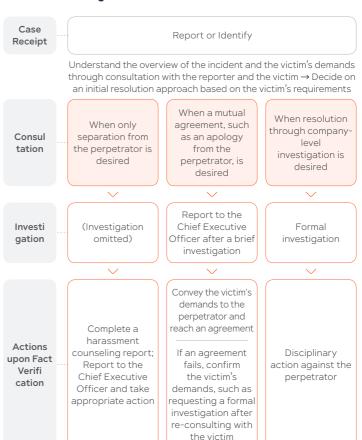

We are conducting the casting, evaluation, training, and debut process in a unique way that contains SM Entertainment's know-how that has been built up over the past 29 years. The selected trainees are growing into future artists under a system that protects and respects their human rights as children and adolescents.

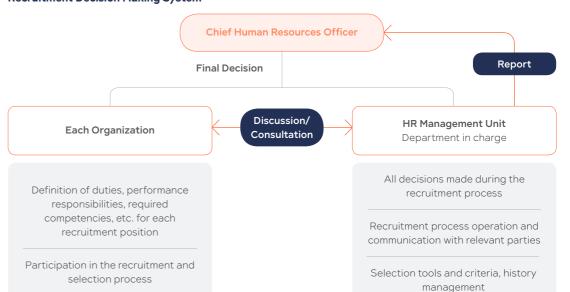

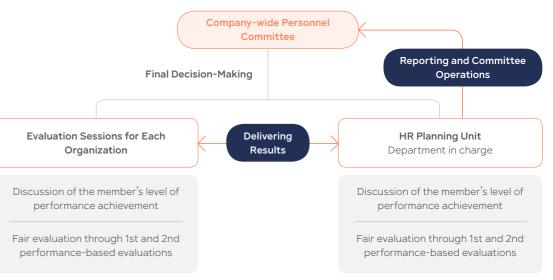
Performance Appraisals and Compensation

SM Entertainment conducts an annual evaluation of the performance of its members for the year, and the evaluation is conducted in 3-4 stages depending on the position or department. To minimize distortions and errors that may occur in the evaluation and to establish a highly inclusive evaluation system through evaluations from various perspectives, the system is continuously inspected and improved. The HR Planning Unit, the department in charge, assigns individual evaluation grades after communication between organizations and approval from the final decision maker, and additionally conducts a multi-faceted review for leaders to check their basic qualities and leadership as leaders and ultimately strives to create a company where all members can work well. Based on the evaluation results determined through the decision-making of evaluators in multiple stages and the evaluation sessions for each organization, the main department conducts a judgment on the suitability of the criteria and then confirms the evaluation results through the Company-wide Personnel Committee. The evaluation results are then disclosed to individuals, and the final decision is made through an objection procedure and agreement with members, and the results are reflected in compensation by setting incentives and annual salaries.

Organizational Culture

Organizational culture refers to the values, beliefs, behavior patterns, and norms shared by members of an organization, and plays an important role in achieving sustainable growth for a company. SM Entertainment is striving to create an organizational culture that grows together based on respect for employees. Since 2023, we have held S-MINGLING DAY every quarter, during which the CEO shares management performance and goals, and communicates with members. Since its establishment until 2010, SM Entertainment has established K-POP culture, leading the growth of the Korean entertainment industry and the global spread of K-POP.

During this period, BoA and TVXQ gained popularity throughout Asia and achieved great success in the Japanese market. After that, the debut of SUPER JUNIOR, Girls' Generation, and SHINEC raised the global awareness of K-POP. This period is called 'SM 1.0'. Then, in 2010, after K-POP established itself as a unique culture representing Korea, EXO, Red Velvet, NCT, and aespa debuted, further strengthening SM Entertainment's global influence, and in the process, many of the company's personnel acquired producing capabilities. Furthermore, SM Entertainment created the 'SM Culture Universe', a future entertainment world combined with cutting-edge technology, a worldview that transcends the virtual and the real. This period until early 2020 is called 'SM 2.0'. And in 2023, the era of SM 3.0 began. As we have accumulated IPs with high potential for success and fostered capable talents, we are once again taking a leap forward as a global entertainment company of a new level through various attempts that only SM Entertainment can make.

IP Development Process

IP is largely divided into primary IP and secondary IP. Primary IP includes albums, performances, broadcasts, etc., and secondary IP consists of MD, IP licensing, fan platforms, and video content based on primary IP results. SM Entertainment has its own IP development process and creates high-quality content based on the know-how it has built up over many years.

In 2024, SM Entertainment will continue its efforts to open new content markets through the launch of new IPs and further strengthen the competitiveness of artists.



Global Business Expansion

SM Entertainment aims to establish a local Multi Production system in America, Japan, and Southeast Asia by 2025, following its five domestic Multi Productions. To this end, it is working closely with major companies in the U.S., Japan, China, and Southeast Asia. We are organizing global dedicated personnel for each production and, through the placement of dedicated personnel in major countries, are conducting various test projects and exploring business opportunities for business diversification.

SMTOWN LIVE

SM Entertainment's global performance brand 'SMTOWN LIVE' has been held successfully in major cities around the world, including Seoul, New York, LA, Paris, Dubai, Santiago, Tokyo, Beijing, Shanghai, Bangkok, and Singapore since 2008, and has been loved by music fans around the world as the No. 1 global performance brand, garnering attention for 'the first Korean single brand concert in Paris, France', 'the first Asian artist to perform at Madison Square Garden in New York', 'the first foreign artist to perform at the Beijing Olympic Stadium in China', and 'the first large-scale K-pop concert in Dubai'.

'SMTOWN LIVE 2023: SMCU PALACE @ KWANGYA' held on January 1, 2023, was broadcast through YouTube, Beyond LIVE, and platforms in countries such as Japan, Indonesia, Thailand, Vietnam, and Saudi Arabia. This is a free online concert by SM Entertainment that started in 2021 during the COVID-19 pandemic, and it offered rich visual experiences, including various collaborations between SM Entertainment's affiliated artists from the 1st to 4th generations, as well as performances of songs from their winter albums.

'SMTOWN LIVE 2023 SMCU PALACE @JAKARTA with KB Bank' held on September 23, 2023, was held in Jakarta, the capital of Indonesia, to coincide with the 50th anniversary of diplomatic relations between Korea and Indonesia. It was broadcast live through platforms such as Beyond LIVE and Japan's KNTV and Weverse and received an explosive response from both local audiences and global music fans watching online. RIIZE, who debuted in 2023, participated in SMTOWN LIVE for the first time, and all artists presented a diverse stage experience for about 4 hours.

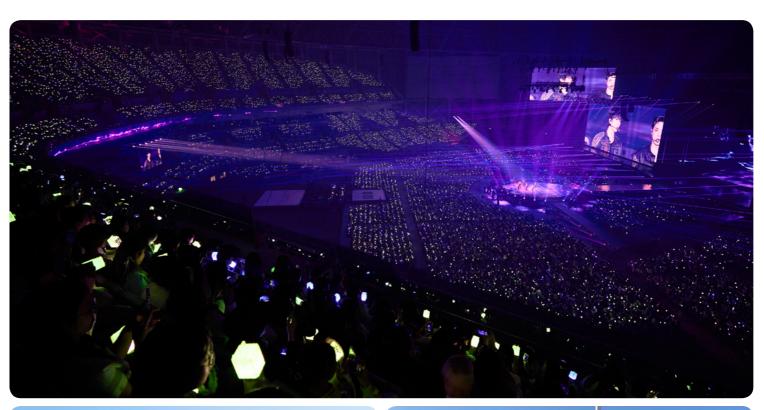

SM Entertainment is communicating and cooperating with its partners so that they can properly manage key issues of sustainable management. For SM Entertainment to leap forward to a higher level of global entertainment company through SM 3.0, synergy with its partners is essential. To this end, SM Entertainment is establishing cooperative relationships with various small and medium-sized enterprises, large corporations, and global companies, and is building mutual trust and close partnerships through fair transactions with its partners. SM Entertainment aims for joint development and coexistence and has established detailed procedures and systems for joint growth at each stage of the cooperation process, including the partner selection stage, negotiation stage, contract signing stage, and work performance stage. In the future, SM Entertainment will comply with relevant laws and regulations, secure transparency and fairness in all transactions with its partners and pursue joint growth with its partners through ethical and rational decision-making.

Supply Chain Management and Promotion of Shared Growth

Concluding a Fair Contract

SM Entertainment has been consistently revising contracts that regulate relationships with partners to ensure that they are fairly concluded in accordance with the enactment/revision of laws and regulations, changes in social norms, etc. We have established an integrity compliance agreement as an item that partners must comply with, and through this, we are preventing legal and ethical risks in advance by practicing ethical values together with partners. In addition, we comply with related laws and government department guidelines and recommendations and avoid concluding contracts that are unilaterally disadvantageous to partners.

Building Long-Term Partnerships

SM Entertainment does not view its partners as simply short-term subcontractors, but as partners with whom it will grow together, and seeks continuous and long-term contractual relationships while avoiding one-time contractual relationships. Through this, it maintains stable business relationships with excellent partners secured through a systematic supply chain selection system and creates synergy by mutually helping each other in the long term.

Support for Industrial Safety of Partners

SM Entertainment is striving to create a safe working environment for employees of partner companies working in the workplace and prevent industrial accidents by regulating safety and health management tasks related to business in accordance with the Industrial Safety and Health Act. We provide guidance and advice on establishing a workplace safety and health management system for employees of partner companies and conduct joint risk assessments to reduce risks in advance. We discuss industrial safety-related matters through the Safety and Health Council comprised of partner companies working in the workplace and conduct joint safety and health inspections every quarter. Through this, SM aims to support the industrial safety of partner companies and prevent industrial accidents.

Support for ESG Education for Partners

SM Entertainment conducts ESG education and workshops for the ESG Working-level Consultative Body and ESG managers of partner companies on a quarterly basis. The workshops consist of education and discussions on ESG policies and key tasks and provide basic ESG education to SM Life Design Group, Dream Maker Entertainment, and SM BRAND MARKETING practitioners with close business ties, and discuss future projects.



Supply Chain Management And Joint Growth

Efforts for Joint Growth

[SM Entertainment] Support for Small and Medium-Sized Content Companies

SM Entertainment participated in the K-content IP (intellectual property) Convergence Production Support Project promoted by Gyeonggi Province in 2023, supporting small and medium-sized content companies in the province to produce content using SM Entertainment's IP. In addition, in August 2023, we presented AR mission content and mini multi-shows at Everland in Gyeonggi Province, featuring SHINee's 15th anniversary debut album concept 'Hard.' Through this, we were able to provide special experiences and enjoyment to fans and visitors and contribute to the growth and competitiveness of small and medium-sized content companies. SM Entertainment will continue to actively help small and medium-sized content companies advance into the domestic and international markets by utilizing its IP and content and promote joint growth and contribute to the growth of the K-content business.

[SM Culture & Contents] Business Agreement with Parastar Entertainment

SM Entertainment's main subsidiary SM Culture & Contents signed a business agreement with PARASTAR Entertainment in May 2023 for joint growth. PARASTAR Entertainment is Korea's first entertainment company specializing in artists with disabilities. Its business agreement aims to improve awareness of disabilities by creating quality content such as joint planning and production of barrier-free content and joint hosting of barrier-free events. In February 2024, RIIZE from SM Entertainment and Big Ocean from PARASTAR Entertainment sang RIIZE's 'Love 119' together in international sign language and promoted the sign language challenge. In addition, we supported Big Ocean to remake H.O.T.'s 'HOPE' as their debut song.

[SM Culture Partners] Startup Investment

SM Culture Partners, an investment subsidiary 100% owned by SM Entertainment, invests in and supports startups that possess technology and business models to enable SM Entertainment's IP to interact with customers in various new ways. In 2022, SM Culture Partners invested in Mine. is Inc., the operator of Charan, which manages everything from collection to sales of secondhand clothing. Charan is a fashion commerce platform that sells secondhand clothing, from popular brands ranging from SPA to luxury brands, at prices up to 90% lower than the regular price, and uses its data to set the optimal price and maximize profits for sellers. SM Entertainment plans to collaborate with Charan to sell affiliated artists' outfits to reduce carbon reduce carbon emissions that could occur from clothing disposal and incineration, thereby practicing environmental protection through resource recycling.

SMile for U

SM Entertainment has implemented the SMile for U campaign with the Korean Committee for UNICEF since 2016 to provide integrated music education to children across Asia. The campaign has delivered music education to children in Hanoi, Da Nang, Kon Tum, Dien Bien, and Gia Lai provinces in Vietnam, making a positive impact on improving the educational environment for children from ethnic minorities and the Vietnamese government's educational direction. To effectively expand music education, the campaign facilitated the development of a music education manual approved by the Ministry of Education (MOET), along with educational materials and guidelines for teacher training. Since 2022, the campaign has extended to the Philippines, continuing its efforts to provide music education to children in two cities and three provinces.

Companies must make decisions that respect the law and social ethics when conducting business activities and establish a system for doing so. SM Entertainment enacted the Internal Information Management Regulations in September 2009, the Compliance Control Standards in November 2019, and the Code of Ethics in May 2020 through a resolution of the Board of Directors. The enacted regulations serve as the decision-making and behavioral standards for all SM Entertainment executives and employees. As of 2023, 100% of SM Entertainment executives and employees have completed ethics/compliance training, and we plan to expand and practice ethical and compliance management by disseminating the Code of Ethics to major affiliates and introducing the Pledge of Ethical Practice.

The external auditor annually audits the company's Internal Control over Financial Reporting and presents an auditor's opinion in the auditor's report.

SM Entertainment respects the fair and free-market economic order and has established fair competition with other businesses as its basic principle. The company is dedicated to fostering joint growth with its partners and preventing unfair practices. In addition, SM Entertainment actively engages in protecting intellectual property rights in collaboration with various partners such as the Korea Intellectual Property Protection Agency, law firms, and patent firms. Internally, the company also provides ongoing education on intellectual property rights to its employees. Furthermore, it has established a collaborative system between the legal support department and the field department to prevent potential legal risks, such as third-party rights infringement, including intellectual property rights.

Expanding the Scope of Registration of Intellectual Property Rights

We expand the scope of domestic and international patent office registrations for trademarks, designs, patents, etc., and execute tasks to protect copyrights for music, videos, images, etc.

Responding to Illegal Products and Rights Infringements

We filter and sanction those who manufacture, distribute, and sell illegal products by stealing SM Entertainment and artist-related trademarks, designs, etc., We also establish a response system with various partners to handle actions infringing the intellectual property rights and other rights.

To comply with laws (Copyright Act, Trademark Act, Fair Trade Act, Personal Information Protection Act, etc.) related to the SM Entertainment's businesses, we frequently conduct training through internal departments in charge and external advisory agencies (law firms, patent firms, etc.) and have established transaction procedures and systems in accordance with related laws to ensure fair transactions.

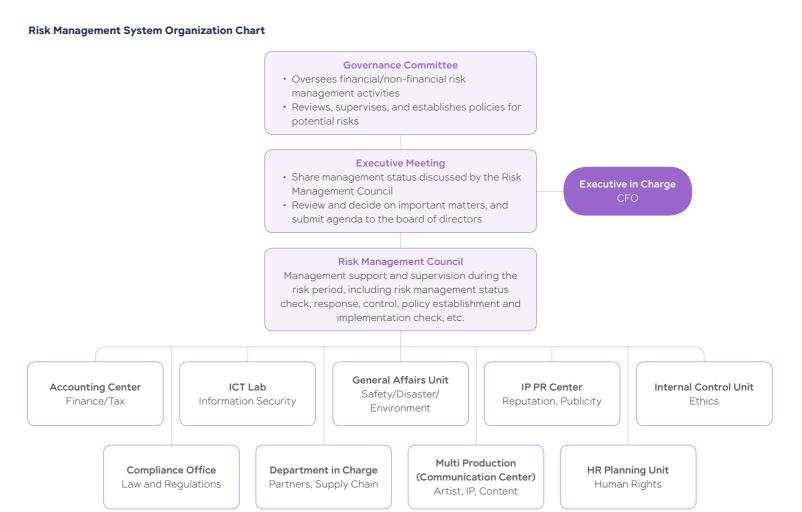

We employ a detailed checklist for each stage, from proposal review to contract process, and before, during, and after activities, to create an environment in which artists can safely travel and focus on their music and concerts.

'KWANGYA 119' Website Launch

In June 2023, SM Entertainment became the first domestic entertainment company to launch a direct communication channel, the 'KWANGYA 119' service, to actively listen to fans' opinions, collaborate with them for the healthy and sustainable development of its artists, and create a better K-POP culture. This service features categories for reporting artist defamation, illegal ticket/copyright infringement, and correction & suggestions. The KWANGYA 119 Unit, the department in charge, communicates with each production and relevant departments to resolve and respond to the cases reported through this service.

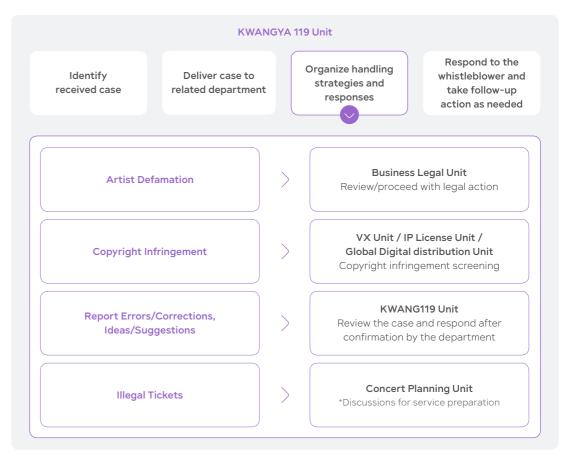
Identification of Case Received via 'KWANGYA 119'

SM Entertainment strives to quickly assess posts received via 'KWANGYA 119' and respond with appropriate strategies set based on the severity of each issue. We prepare and share 'Weekly/Monthly Statistical Report' with each department, outlining top traffic, issue rankings, processing progress per bulletin board, key figures, and insights, in addition to daily issue briefings. Depending on the severity and distribution of the issues, we inform relevant departments through 'Quarterly Report'. We also compile cumulative trends, key figures, and insights into a 'Comprehensive Statistical Report' for sharing and discussion with relevant departments. Accordingly, as of December 31, 2023, we have responded to 172,343 cases out of 181,701 cases received, achieving a response rate of 94.9%.

'KWANGYA 119' Response and Handling Process

Through the 'KWANGYA 119' service, SM Entertainment collects cases reporting artist defamation, insults, copyright infringement, correction & suggestions, and more. We have established a process that enables rapid response by classifying and reporting cases collected daily and conducting additional monitoring. In addition, we assess and prioritize posts on issues/reports/needs on each bulletin board, sharing them via internal channels to allow each production and relevant departments to respond collaboratively. To prevent the negative factors affecting the company and artists, we have adopted preventive measures and monitoring.

Transparent Information Management

SM Entertainment understands that sustainable management is based on stakeholder capitalism and is creating a foundation for stakeholders to participate in decision-making and execution of all corporate management activities. First, we identified key direct and indirect stakeholders, and are diversifying communication and participation channels for each stakeholder. In addition, we are disclosing contents related to the environment, society, and governance, which are the main contents of ESG, in accordance with the global sustainability disclosure standards.

Corporate Homepage Revamp

SM Entertainment has reorganized its corporate website in the first half of 2024 to transparently and promptly disclose IR information to shareholders and stakeholders. The IR Schedule page displays the monthly main IR schedules, and the Business Results page provides access to quarterly earnings release presentation materials. In particular, we have made efforts to increase accessibility and understanding for more shareholders and stakeholders by providing earnings release presentation materials in both Korean and English as PowerPoint documents and scripts. Additionally, information on the composition, details, and activities of the Board of Directors is available on the corporate website. SM Entertainment will continue to update the aforementioned content to ensure transparent information disclosure and management in the future.

Sustainability Report Publication and Ratings Disclosure

SM Entertainment publishes and discloses the 2023 Sustainability Report, following 2021 and 2022, and has produced and released an explanatory video to help stakeholders' understanding. The main content, including SM Entertainment's Sustainability Report, are available on the website, and the results of the external evaluation based on efforts to advance sustainable management have also been disclosed.

Board Effectiveness, Independence, Expertise, Diversity & Evaluation and Relevance of Remuneration

SM Entertainment's Board of Directors is the highest decision-making body of the company and exercises responsible decision-making for sustainable management. SM Entertainment has established a board of directors with independence, expertise, and diversity for sustainable corporate management in 2023.

Board Independence and Transparency

SM Entertainment has secured the independence of the board of directors by separating the CEO and the chairman of the board and introducing the outside director system to operate an independent board of directors that prioritizes the interests of all stakeholders. The Articles of Incorporation stipulate that outside directors account for at least one-fourth of the total number of directors, and as of March 2024, the proportion of outside directors is 50%. Among the committees under the board of directors, the Nominating Committee and the Governance Committee are composed entirely of outside directors. While each committee is composed solely of directors who are not inside directors, it is mandated that at least two-thirds of the members be outside directors, thereby ensuring the Committees' Independence within the board. In addition, the activities of the board of directors and committees are disclosed through public documents such as business reports and the Corporate Governance Charter, thereby establishing a transparent governance structure.

Board Expertise

SM Entertainment announced the SM 3.0 strategy, including the transition to a Multi Production Center/Label system, IP monetization strategy, global expansion strategy, and investment strategy. In order to realize this, a board of directors with expertise was formed. Outside directors were recommended as candidates with expertise in each field, including management, K-POP, governance, law, technology/platform, global, finance/M&A, and accounting/taxation, and independence and qualification were reviewed to form a team of outside directors with the highest expertise in each field.

Board Committee Structure and Roles and Responsibilities

SM Entertainment has strengthened the functions and independence of the board of directors by forming a total of four committees under the board of directors: the Nominating Committee, the Insider Trading Committee, the Compensation Committee, and the Governance Committee. Each committee is comprised of directors with expertise in their respective fields, and reviews, approves, and resolves not only matters delegated by the board of directors, but also environmental, social, and governance issues, thereby enhancing management accountability and efficiency.

Board Expertise

SM Entertainment has established a board of directors with the highest level of independence, expertise, and diversity in Korea through a fair and reliable recommendation process. The inside directors are composed of members eligible for entertainment industry expertise and management, and the outside directors are composed of candidates with the highest level of expertise in each field, and the independence and qualification of the candidates have been verified. We have also formed a non-executive board of directors to actively support the implementation of the SM 3.0 strategy. In particular, the outside directors have selected the best candidates by analyzing the independence and qualification of the candidates and the board skill matrix (board of directors' capabilities matrix) after forming a pool of more than 30 experts in various fields by considering SM Entertainment's business model and future plans. After going through a screening process including the Commercial Act requirements for Outside Directors, whether there is a conflict of interest with the company, reasons for disqualification, and conducting a reputation check, the board of directors confirmed whether each candidate would accept the position of director, and recommended 6 outside director candidates, and the board of directors has completed the appointment of 5 outside directors and 2 other non-executive directors.

The Korea Quality Foundation has conducted verification of the '2023 SM Entertainment Sustainability Report' (hereinafter referred to as the 'Report') at the request of SM Entertainment Co., Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as 'SM Entertainment'). The Korea Quality Foundation is responsible for providing an independent third-party verification opinion on the Report in accordance with the verification criteria and scope specified below, and the responsibility for the preparation of this Report lies with the management of SM Entertainment.

Verification Criteria and Scope

- Verification Type: Type 1 Verification of the reliability of the four principles of Accountability and data collection method

Verification Method

The review team reviewed the relevant procedures, systems, and control methods and available performance data to verify the validity of the report contents by applying the above criteria. The documents verified during the verification process are as follows.

- Non-financial information: Data provided by SM Entertainment and integrated regular disclosure reports, data researched through the media and the Internet, etc.
- Financial information: SM Entertainment financial statements and data disclosed on the Financial Supervisory Service's electronic disclosure system (dart.fss.or.kr) and data posted on the website, etc., are not included in the verification scope

This verification was conducted through written verification including on-site visits and interviews with the person in charge. The validity of the materiality assessment procedure in the report, the selection of issues considering the stakeholders, the data collection/management and report writing procedures, and the validity of the descriptions were evaluated through interviews with the person in charge, but interviews with external stakeholders were not conducted. Afterwards, it was confirmed that some errors, inappropriate information, and unclear expressions discovered in the above steps were appropriately supplemented before the report was published.

Competence and Independence

The audit team for this verification was competently organized in accordance with the internal regulations of the Korea Foundation for Quality. In addition to providing third-party verification services, the Korea Foundation for Quality has no conflicts of interest that could impede the independence and fairness of verification across SM Entertainment's business.

Limitations

The completeness and responsiveness of the performance data presented in the report have inherent limitations depending on the nature of the data and the method used to determine, calculate and estimate the figures. The audit team conducted a comparative review of the information and basis provided under the contract, and the reliability of the original data itself was confirmed through data sampling. In addition, the greenhouse gas emissions data for the three subsidiaries reported in this report were not included in the scope of this verification.



Findings and Verification Conclusion

As a result of the above verification activities, the audit team determined that the contents of this report were prepared in accordance with GRI Standards 2021 and that a reasonable basis was secured to prove the four principles of AA1000AP (2018) and the Type 1 assurance level of AA1000AS (v3). In addition, no significant errors or inappropriate matters related to compliance with the principles were found in the contents of this report.

Inclusivity

SM Entertainment has defined six stakeholder groups (shareholders and investors/analysts, media, customers, government/local governments, institutions and local organizations/NGOs, employees) and is identifying key ESG issues of interest to stakeholders by operating communication channels that take into account the characteristics of each group. The audit team could not find any major stakeholders who were omitted in this process and was able to confirm that efforts are being made to ensure that the opinions of the identified stakeholders are appropriately reflected in management activities.

Materiality

SM Entertainment created a pool of 23 issues through comparative analysis of media, related laws and regulations, industry benchmarking, and global initiatives, and finally selected 7 material issues by reflecting social and environmental assessments and financial impact assessments for each issue and a survey of internal and external stakeholders. In the process, the legitimacy of selecting material issues was enhanced by reviewing both the impact of corporate activities on the environment and society and the financial impact of environmental and social factors on the company. The review team confirmed that the material issues identified were given more weight in this report and that the material issues identified during the evaluation process were reported in the report without omission.

Responsiveness

SM Entertainment is making efforts to respond in a timely manner to the demands and major concerns collected from stakeholders. The audit team found no evidence that the organization's response activities and performance regarding key issues were inadequately reported.

Impact

SM Entertainment is identifying and monitoring the impact of key issues related to stakeholders throughout its business activities and is reporting the content to the extent possible. The audit team found no evidence that the impact related to key issues was inadequately measured and reported.

Recommendations for Improvement

- We expect SM Entertainment's ESG management performance to be managed more efficiently by specifying the monitoring plan for ESG-related data and improving the reproducibility of information through the operation of a systematic data management system.
- We expect SM Entertainment's ESG management performance to be delivered more meaningfully to stakeholders through attempts and efforts to interpret and analyze internal management data in various ways.

The following conclusions are provided regarding the greenhouse gas emissions data included in the greenhouse gas emissions report.

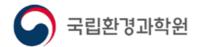
- 1) The greenhouse gas emissions were appropriately calculated in accordance with the verification criteria.
